We met in person in 2023 and were acquaintances briefly. In 2023, he attempted to attack me and we ended up in a physical altercation. Since that time, we have not had any personal or friendly relationship, but he has continued to harass and threaten me online and in person.

# ATTACHMENT 7

**Case Title:** *Armon Wiggins vs. Donat Ricketts*

On Tuesday, November 26, 2025, while I was covering a court case in Miami, the respondent confronted me inside the courthouse bathroom. He called me derogatory names, became aggressive, and told me he was going to fight me. An officer of the court was present and witnessed the threat. When we returned to the courtroom, the judge stopped the proceedings to ask who was being threatened, and a lawyer informed the judge that he heard the respondent making threats toward me.”

This incident is part of a long pattern of harassment dating back to 2023. In 2023, the respondent attempted to attack me, and we ended up in a physical altercation. Since that time, he has continued to harass, threaten, and target me both online and in person.”

From 2023 through 2025, the respondent has repeatedly posted hostile, threatening, and harassing content directed at me on social media. I have more than 20–30 videos, tweets, and posts in which he insults me, threatens violence, and tries to provoke confrontation.

**On November 29, 2025, he posted a direct threatening message toward me on X.com stating: 'Imma stay on your neck coward.' This message was targeted at me by name and continues his ongoing escalation.**

**I have not contacted or threatened the respondent. Even when I make general public posts unrelated to him, he takes them personally and responds with threats, harassment, and attempts to provoke conflict. His behavior is escalating, obsessive, and unpredictable.**

**I fear for my personal safety. I am requesting immediate protection from the respondent due to the pattern of harassment, the recent direct threats, and the escalation witnessed inside a courthouse.**

**Additional Ongoing Concerns:**

**The harassment has continued into November 2025 and remains active as of this week. The person in Item 2 has recently posted publicly that he intends to attend multiple upcoming court hearings and trials, including dates where I actively work as a reporter and content creator. He has already confronted me in person at a courthouse in Miami, where he verbally threatened me in the bathroom and stated he wanted to fight me. His online posts indicate that he intends to continue showing up wherever court cases are taking place, which puts me at direct risk of further confrontations while I am working.**

**I am not seeking contact with him, but he repeatedly targets me online, tags me by name, threatens to "stay on my neck," and makes statements suggesting confrontation. This makes me fear that future in-person harassment or violence will occur during my work assignments.**

**I also became aware that the person in Item 2 has an open misdemeanor case in Los Angeles Superior Court, Case No. LAX3AR11126-01, with future court dates scheduled. While I am not using this case to allege wrongdoing, it increases my fear because it shows a pattern of volatility, and I am concerned about my safety when he continues targeting me directly.**

**Because a major part of my job requires me to be inside courthouses reporting on legal proceedings, I cannot avoid these locations. I am requesting protection so I can safely work without being threatened, confronted, or harassed in person or online.**

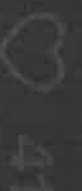


Exhibit A Direct Threat

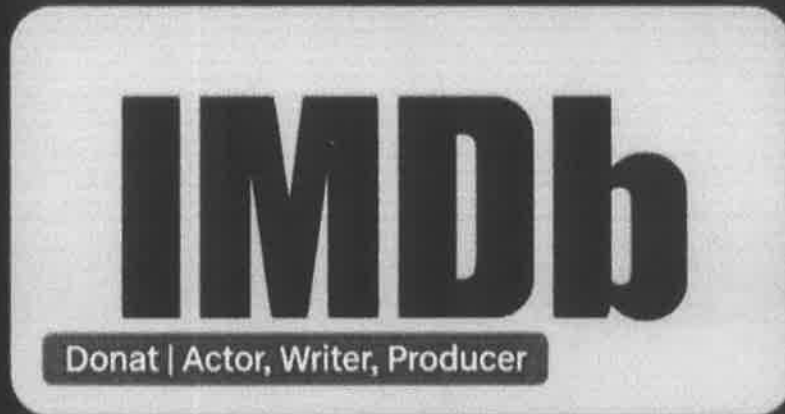
